I. CALL TO ORDER: Commission Chair Nancy MacWood called to order Advisory Neighborhood Commission 3C (ANC3C's) regular monthly meeting for May 19, 2008 at 7:30 p.m. The meeting was held in the community room at the Second District Police Station, 3320 Idaho Avenue, NW, Washington, DC 20008.

II. VERIFICATION OF NOTICE: Chair MacWood verified that the proper notice was published on the website, listservs and in the Northwest Current.

III. ESTABLISHMENT OF QUORUM: At 7:34, Chair MacWood acknowledged that a quorum (5 of 8 commissioners) had been established. Other commissioners present included Gloria Day, Catherine May, Trudy Reeves, Stephanie Zobay and Lee Brian Reba. (NOTE: Commissioners Richard Rothblum and Bruce Beckner came after the meeting had been called to order.)

VII. Introduction of Acting Commander Mark Carter and Officer Baker

Commander Carter was introduced and he gave a brief recap of his recent experience and aims for the 2nd District.

Commissioners asked that the special operations traffic officer be reinstated. He agreed.

NOTE: Commissioner Beckner arrived at 7:44.

The commission discussed the recent upswing in burglaries in the 2nd District as a whole. Officers are doing "Target Hardening Surveys" -- informing citizens of ways to make themselves less of a target for burglaries. His contact information is as follows:

VIII. Introduction of Clark Ray, Director, DC Dept. of Parks and Recreation

Mr. Ray updated the commission on the progress of Hearst Playground. By May 29 they should have a design and will start construction in the summer. They expect construction to take about 90-100 days.

Mr. Ray also discussed Macomb playground. Renovations will start on June 23 and basketball courts will be resurfaced in the fall.

Commissioners asked about the arsenic problems at Fort Reno. Mr. Ray said that the arsenic levels look good and that they want to move forward on renovating the field.

Mr. Ray was asked about dog parks. He described the Dog Park Advisory Committee that is reviewing potential sites. The committee is made of representatives from the Department of Health, Department of the Environment, Humane Society, two veterinarians, and four citizens -- Kathy Silva (recused from Newark issue), Darren Binder, and two non dog-owners.

IX. Community Forum

1. An audience member asked whether there was a procedure to give George Bush's job to him and fire 1/3 of the congress. Commissioners said they would take the issue under advisement.
2. A community member spoke in support of a rapid service bus line, which is scheduled to come online on June 30.

IX. Commission Business

- a. Consideration of \$750 grant application from the Second District Community Advisory Council for cost of awards presented to police officers at the annual appreciation dinner

Chair MacWood introduced the grant and moved the resolution to approve the grant. Commissioner May seconded. Chair MacWood amended language in a “whereas”. The amendment was approved by a unanimous voice vote.

- b. Consideration of Public Space application for curb cut, driveways, retaining wall, and porch projection associated with new construction of two houses at 3036 and 3038 Macomb St. respectively.

Curt Schreffler, engineer, presented plans. Chair MacWood detailed history of the property.

Chair MacWood read her resolution. Commissioner Reba offered clarifying language. Chair MacWood clarified in discussion that if the Army Corps and the Department of the Environment denies the requests regarding the lots, the applicant would have to come back to the commission.

NOTE: Commissioner Rothblum arrived at 9:10.

The amendments were accepted by a unanimous voice vote, 8-0. The resolution was approved as amended by a vote of 7-0 (1 abstention) as follows:

X. Officer’s Reports

- a. Secretary’s Report: Approval of the April Minutes. Commissioner Rothblum moved the approval of the minutes, with the proviso that non-substantive changes be made and passed around to the commission, seconded by Commissioner Beckner. **The minutes were approved by a unanimous voice vote, 8-0.**

X. SMD/Committee Reports

- a. Commissioner Beckner updated the commission about the McLean Bible Church: both the government and the applicant are asking for postponement.
- b. Commissioner May updated the commission regarding Save Mass Ave. They are trying to stop paving in public space at Iranian Embassy. She reported that there is a dispute between public space and the State Department. She is

trying to get embassies working with the state department to comply with district policies.

- c. Commissioner Reeves reported a fire in McLean Gardens.
- d. Commissioner Reba announced that DDOT repaving Cathedral Avenue from Connecticut east to Woodley place.

XI ADJOURNMENT: Commissioner Zobay moved to adjourn, Commissioner Beckner seconded. Without objection, the meeting was adjourned at 9:36 pm.
